It would be a good idea for anyone who plans to audition for the musical to rent the movie during the summer. Of course, our play will be considerably shorter than the movie version, but the students will have some background about the story.

## **St. Pius X Annual School Auction**

These numbers are due to the high dollar bids, the sponsorship on the dinner for the evening, (which, by the way, is always delicious) and the donated time of the committee members to bring together the talent and time of volunteers that help the school in any way deemed necessary.

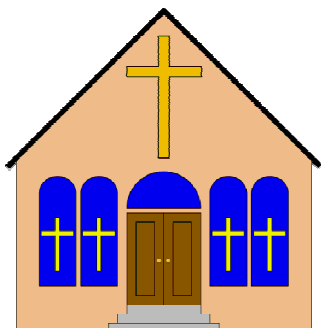
The auction is a night full of fun, various games and bid wars. The fish bowls are smaller items pulled together with fun-filled basket themes. Players buy tickets to try to win the prize. Some items include family memberships

to the zoo, handmade items, jewelry, books or school items. There are also silent auction tables that are usually a little higher in value and more tempting to the bidder. Some items have been local Catholic high school items, tax services, hotel stays and local art work.

The highlight of the evening is the LIVE auction in which our community donates items to be put on the auction block and the friendly battle to be the winner begins. Corn hole games, Myrtle Beach vacations, Browns football tickets and delicious dinner parties were a few items in the bidding process. However, the main event of this event has and will always be the items which the classes make. Each classroom does a project in which everyone is a part of and that item then goes up for auction. Parents battle it out in some friendly competition. How great will it be, when your children are grown up and on their own, to see what they made or to see their thumbprint on a piece of class art. The money raised by these class projects stays right in the classroom, so that the teacher has extra money to use and again, provide an auction item the following year.

The generosity of others and the willingness of everyone and anyone working together explains it all. We are a close knit community and working together as a school for the benefit of our students exhibits the true devotion of our St. Pius X community.

The auctioneer for the evening, Mr. Jay Montrie, summed it up best. "That St. Pius School knows what they are doing!"

## Parish Visioning

"You've got to have a dream. If you don't have a dream, how you gonna make a dream come true?" These lyrics from a song in the musical SOUTH PACIFIC perhaps best explain the need for visioning at St. Pius X parish. To keep healthy and viable, a parish has to continually be looking forward, making plans and executing those plans as it moves into the future.

What is it that we at St. Pius want for our future? How will we meet the needs of our own generation as well as succeeding generations? Parish volunteers recently gathered for two visioning sessions. At the first session, participants were asked to form small groups and brainstorm ideas in ten areas: communications, evangelization, facilities and grounds, faith formation, worship and liturgy, outreach to the needy, parish and school, social, stewardship, and other. Many, many dreams were offered for consideration, and many, many suggestions were provided.

At the second meeting, participants were asked to reconsider the list of multiple suggestions and measure them against a set of five criteria. Any project or goal for the betterment of the parish had to be specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time framed. For instance, in the area of communications, some very specific suggestions were offered. Most agreed that a parish newsletter is essential for keeping parishioners informed. Another suggestion was the need to improve the parish website and ensure that it is updated regularly with information on parish activities and school sports programs.

Recommendations in the category Facilities and Grounds were also quite specific. Among these were the need for additional storage space, the expansion of handicapped parking and the hiring of a professional landscape architect to develop a comprehensive plan for parish grounds.

Faith Formation visioning incorporated the perceived need for regular retreats and days of reflection. Also recommended were prayer breakfasts for men and for women. Regarding the youth of the parish, everyone agreed on the need to keep youth involved and active in the parish community.

These are but a few of the many projects and goals that were brought forward at the parish visioning sessions. Whereas visioning is the first step, implementation gives shape and form to the vision. As the planning sessions continue, further information will be provided. With the good will, time, talent and prayers of all in the faith community, St. Pius will confidently move into the future.
